### **Current UK Risk Level: HIGH**

The risk to the UK has been raised to high (as of 13/03/2020).

As of 13 Mar, UK is in the 'delay' phase of the government's action plan to limit the spread of the virus.

### **Current UK Situation**

- As of 9am 6 April, 208,837 people have been tested, of whom 51,608 confirmed positive. As of 5pm on 5 April, of those hospitalised in the UK who tested positive for coronavirus, 5,373 have died. Figures for test results and for deaths are compiled from different sources, which is why the figures for deaths are reported from an earlier point in time than the figures for test results. Latest numbers can be viewed here.
- In Suffolk we have 243 confirmed cases. However, with routine community testing discontinued, these figures will not describe the full extent of cases locally. You can view the latest UK dashboard of cases by local authority here.
- Foreign Secretary's statement on coronavirus (COVID-19): 6 April 2020
  - The Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) is working with other governments and the airlines to bring home as many stranded British nationals as possible, prioritising most vulnerable citizens. On commercial flights over 200,000 UK nationals have come back to the UK from Spain, 13,000 from Egypt, 8,000 from Indonesia and on charted flights from 7 different countries more than 2,000 British nationals have been bought to the UK.

- Coronavirus (COVID-19): letter to councils about local authority meetings and postponement of elections- Letter from the Ministry of Housing,
  Communities and Local Government to local authority chief executives explaining two sets of regulations made under the Coronavirus Act 2020. The
  first set of regulations enables all local authority meetings before 7 May 2021 to be held remotely and removes the requirement for the annual
  meeting this year. The second set postpones until 6 May 2021 local by-elections and other polls, either scheduled or which would otherwise arise
  before that date.

- Coronavirus (COVID-19): letter to pharmacists from Jo Churchill-The Minister for Prevention, Public Health and Primary Care thanks pharmacy teams for their work and says what the government has done so far to support community pharmacy.
- Coronavirus (COVID-19): scaling up testing programmes-The government has now released the full paper online detailing steps on how it intends to scale up testing to 100,000 test a day from all five pillars of the strategy, across the UK by the end of this month.
- Prime Minister Boris Johnson was taken to intensive care last night as a precautionary measure, however as of Tuesday morning, Michael Gove has
  confirmed he has not been ventilated.

#### Suffolk

- **PPE Update:** SCC are providing a centralised cell for PPE in Suffolk this system is in place to understand daily consumption rates of PPE for all non NHS areas. SCC have been collating information for CYP, ACS, districts and boroughs, police, fire and this is then fed into the stock and procurement system. SCC have established some good supply chains in place nationally and internationally sourced through the procurement team. Endeavour House, Ipswich, is the central base for all PPE delivery, storage, pack prep and distribution. This has been in place for two weeks and packs are being send out to front line services in Suffolk on a daily basis. SCC are also being supported by MoD military planners (stock control, logistics). The one off delivery from central govt will be used for priority areas of health, care and social care areas as directed. This will arrive in Suffolk on Tuesday and will bolster existing stock.
  - SCC appeal: As announced last week SCC have launched an appeal for businesses in the county to donate any unused Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to ensure our critical front-line staff working in care homes, children's homes and people's own homes can continue to give care and support to Suffolk's most vulnerable residents. SCC are willing to purchase stocks if donating PPE is something businesses could not support and would be happy to discuss this with them. If businesses think they could help we ask that they contact PPE@suffolk.gov.uk with; their current PPE stock information (type and quantity), where they are located in Suffolk and a contact number.
- Communities update: There have been more than 1900 to the phoneline for the most vulnerable in Suffolk. The freephone number is **0800 876 6926** and it is staffed 9am 5pm, every day. Call handlers from across councils are reporting that people are anxious, isolated and worried however, there is also a great sense of personal resilience and community spirit. There is a need for short-term food deliveries, which we can resolve swiftly, and a need for people requiring more information related to their own personal situations.
  - **Tribe Volunteer App:** 30 volunteers have already been matched via this app and this will continue to increase with improved functionality of the app. SCC are working with a developer to improve it and get the most from it. This is not designed to stop any of the existing help and support already in neighbourhoods and people should continue to volunteer in their communities.

- Volunteer Shopper payments: SALC have published guidance on their website for volunteers and those in receipt of volunteer food deliveries on how best to arrange payment and how town and parish councils can help. For more information visit:

- Support for family carers: Family carers across Suffolk are facing the additional challenge of continuing to provide much needed care for adults while the coronavirus pandemic continues. In Suffolk, good information and support for carers is more important than ever. Suffolk Family Carers, Dementia Together and a host of other Suffolk-based carer organisations are continuing to provide practical and emotional support. Suffolk Family Carers have been in contact with the many carers currently known to them, the focus of activity has rapidly been realigned to signposting carers to immediate support where needed and to address wellbeing issues.
